CAS Village Halls and Community Buildings survey



Mid Suffolk Locality Funding now available

Mid Suffolk District Council's Locality Award programme is now open and is welcoming applications until Saturday 30 September 2017.

The programme means that each Mid Suffolk councillor has a £6,250 pot that he or she can use to award to projects or organisations that have a direct impact on Mid Suffolk communities. Funding awards can range from £250 upwards and each councillor can support up to 15 projects.
