**a) SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCILLOR RICHARD SMITH**

As we have received no correspondence relating to the proposed yellow lines markings in Thorpeness he would look into.

### **Leiston and Aldeburgh Priorities**

- **Leiston Youth Priority** – to reduce the littering on parks at Victory Road and King George’s Avenue Leiston Working with partner agencies to make the parks a safer environment for young people to enjoy.
- **Leiston and Aldeburgh** – Speeding – to conduct speed enforcement at identified hotspots.
- **Aldeburgh** to target illegal parking in the following areas High Street, The Terrace, Fawcett Road, Beaconsfield Road and Hartington Road.

c) COASTAL PROTECTION  
& SIZEWELL C

#### Nuclear Detailed Emergency Planning Zone

The Office for Nuclear Regulation has formally issued its determination of the Detailed Emergency Planning Zone following the decommissioning of Sizewell A and updated for the ongoing operation of Sizewell B.

The boundary is to the north of Thorpeness and avoids the difficulty of splitting the village and dealing with non-residents whilst still providing several times the distance for the worst reasonably foreseeable event. A wider Precautionary Emergency Zone is provided for the remote possibility of a catastrophic situation.

Most surrounding villages are outside the DEPZ which helps to achieve reliable administration of emergency arrangements. However in trying to reconcile the wishes of Leiston not to be split, part of Aldringham has been included in the DEPZ to a point where a practicable can be located. Parts of Sizewell within the Parish are also included and will require to be catered for in the Parish Emergency Plan.

#### Coastal Impact of Sizewell C

A meeting between SCAR and EDFE was attended on 8<sup>th</sup> May. A column-supported jetty long enough to permit deep water berthing beyond Sizewell Banks will be required during the construction of Sizewell C, and then dismantled. A permanent shoreline structure will

remain for infrequent berthing of shallow water vessels during the life of the station. Intakes and outfalls will be tunnelled and not dredged.

EDFE recognised our concerns to share the hydrodynamics, geomorphological and landform linked modelling, calibration and sensitivity testing against possible climate change scenarios and engineering designs. EDFE are also developing a wider ranging coastal process study which would be of major value to the community.

EDFE said it would be prepared to advance the sharing of information as consultation proceeds into Stage 2.

#### Alde and Ore Estuary Partnership – Flood Cell 10 (north)

A meeting of the Partnership was attended on 8<sup>th</sup> May at Thorpeness Country Club. AOEP Flood Cell 10 now includes areas at risk as far north as Thorpeness village. We have been invited to provide data for risk assessments. Louise Mangeot has kindly offered to be the Parish Council's link with AOEP.

**ACTION:** A meeting will be arranged to help provide the data required.
