Countdown to the Tour

There are 80 days left to the start of the OVO Energy Tour of Britain, which is coming to Suffolk Coastal Stage One of the Tour starts in Edinburgh on Sunday 3rd September, with Suffolk gearing up for the arrival of Stage Six on Friday 8th September. Stage Six is being

held entirely within Suffolk, starting from Newmarket and travelling east to finish in Aldeburgh. Suffolk Coastal is hosting the Stage Finish on Aldeburgh's High Street.

Enabling Broadband Project

The Suffolk Better Broadband Programme aims to provide superfast fibre broadband coverage across Suffolk. However, it is now recognised there is likely to be 2-3% of properties across Suffolk that will not have access to reasonable broadband services, when the existing programme ends in mid 2020. In rural areas, the percentage of properties without access is expected to be much higher. The Suffolk Better Broadband Programme Project continues to work with the government to develop a policy which completes the rollout to these 'hardest to reach' communities, which are predominately in rural areas. But, as yet, there are no firm commitments or additional funding agreed. In keeping with Suffolk Coastal Enabling Communities ethos, we are planning to establish an Enabling Broadband Project, to support our communities who are likely to establish an Enabling Broadband Project, to support our communities who are likely to be among the 2-3% left without access to an affordable high speed broadband service.

East Suffolk House is officially opened

Suffolk Coastal District Council's new headquarters in Melton were officially opened on Thursday 15th June.

Over 100 guests were present to see the Lord-Lieutenant of Suffolk, Clare Countess of Euston, carryout the opening duties – amid praise for the design of the new building.

All the Staff moved into East Suffolk House in December 2016 and have settled in well to the new open plan working environment.

The Council's old offices in Melton Hill, Woodbridge have been sold, subject to contract, and the site will be used to create much-needed new homes for the town.

By downsizing, Suffolk Coastal aims to significantly reduce its spending on the running costs of its headquarters. The move will save the Council, and the tax payer, an estimated £200.000 a year in running costs, rising to £500.000 a year in the longer term.

The total cost for the project has come in under budget at 5.5 million. The cost of land acquisition and building new premises was 3.9 million, which was met from existing resources.

Suffolk Coastal elects new Chairman

Suffolk Coastal District Council's new Chairman is Councillor Chris Blundell.

Councillor Blundell who represents the Martlesham Ward will be Chairman for the next 12 months, taking on the post from Councillor Mark Newton.

c) NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Not much has progressed since the last meeting.

At the Parish Council Meeting on 3rd April 2017 the following was discussed and should have been recorded in the Minutes under Neighbourhood Plan: Concerns over affordable housing in areas with a high number of second homes has led to the government allocating money to help solve the problem, of which Suffolk Coastal District Council has been allocated £1.5 m. We have been asked if we would like a feasibility study to be carried out to see if it could be appropriate for our parish, particularly Thorpeness where it may lead to an enabling development that could contribute to maintaining coastal defences. The study would be at no cost and place no obligations upon the parish to accept affordable housing. It was unanimously agreed to accept the offer of a feasibility study.
