# **EAST SUFFOLK COUNCIL – DISTRICT COUNCILLOR RUSS RAINGER**

Russ Rainger commented and answered questions on the SPR Wind Farm proposals. He reported Community Groups, organisations, Town and Parish Councils can apply for a new Community Pantries Grant which will help to provide affordable food to East Suffolk residents in need.

The pantries will provide a welcoming space, similar to a shop, where people can pay a subscription of less than £5.00 per week and receive food worth at least £15.00. Grants of up to £4,500.00 are available and applications close on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2023. Visit the East Suffolk Council website for details.
