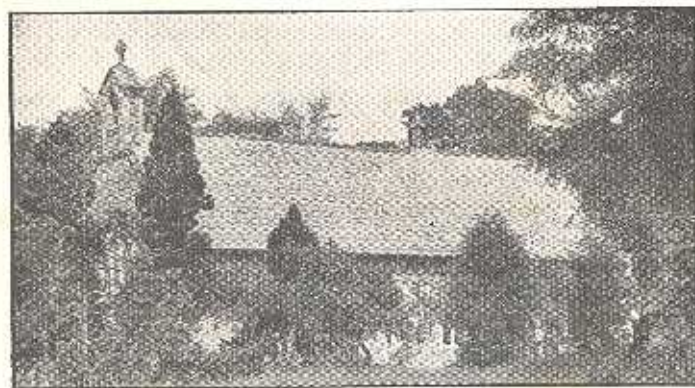

We call "the laying on of hands" Confirmation and in this way a person is made a full member of the Church. Anyone of the age of 12 or over is able to be Confirmed.

Some of you may have decided already that you wish to be Confirmed, others may first want to know what this involves. I want to ask everyone to think about this because there will be Confirmation Classes at the Vicarage for various age groups.

May I ask those of you who want to know more about Confirmation before deciding, as well as those who have definitely made up their minds, to let me know so that I can make up the classes.

The Confirmation Service will take place in about six months time. The instruction classes will be held each week. To start with there will also be introductory classes for those who are not certain.

Already I have some names and when I hear from others or talk to you about Confirmation I will tell you when to come—day, time etc.

This month I am devoting the whole of my letter to this most important subject. At the same time I would like to draw your attention to the Monthly Family Service Notice. These two things are not unconnected because our full entry into the life of our church occurs inevitably through the family.

We live and grow as families and it is Our Heavenly Father's wish that we should live and grow in knowledge of Him into full and adult members of His Family.
