Skills Show 2016

Last week, EDF Energy took part in the annual event at Trinity Park which attracted 5,000 visitors.

The event is a great opportunity for businesses in the energy sector to speak directly to thousands of young people about employment opportunities in Suffolk. The aim of EDF Energy's participation each year is to inspire students to develop Science, Engineering Technology and Maths skills presenting them with the various career opportunities available at our power stations now and into the future through the new build programme, including Sizewell C.

We already run successful apprenticeship and graduate schemes across our power stations. Sizewell B apprentices were on hand to guide students through interactive games and share experiences about their four-year Engineering maintainence apprenticeship scheme, one of the many early careers programmes offered by EDF Energy.

Suffolk Festival of Learning

Over 1000 people from the teaching community in Suffolk including: Primary, Secondary, Further and Higher Education providers took part in the augural event last week.

The aim of the event was to link up local business with the teaching community to gain a better mutual understanding of the skills and services needed and how teachers can play a role in developing the local workforce whilst also supporting local businesses.

EDF Energy had the opportunity to engage with teachers and senior education leaders to underscore the importance of STEM and the opportunities that may arise for young people in Suffolk through the development of Sizewell C and that which is already on offer at Sizewell B.

Jim Crawford, Sizewell C project development director told leaders in education at the launch of the Festival of Learning today: "We want local people to have the best opportunity to gain employment and skills from Sizewell C.

"We are currently working in partnership with local schools, colleges, training providers and the local authorities to help develop an education programme and the skills required to support the construction of Sizewell C."

The event was organised with the support of West Suffolk College, Suffolk Chamber of Commerce, University of Suffolk and Suffolk Association of Secondary Headteachers.
