1. Dedham Vale AONB and Stour Valley Forum 2017

2. Suffolk Coast & Heaths Beachwatch Update

Suffolk Coast & Heaths Spring Beachwatch Survey took place on 24 April. 15 volunteers attended. 17Kg of rubbish collected. 100m of beach cleaned and surveyed. Finds included a large lump of paraffin wax (to be sent to CEFAS for analysis) plenty of HDPE plastic to be sent to TerraCycle for recycling. Suffolk wide results available later in the year.
