

## July 2017 AONB Monthly update



- 1. Wonderful volunteers contributed....... <u>1,975</u> days to the AONBs in the last year
  - The AONB benefit hugely from volunteer activity. The AONBs facilitated 1,975 volunteer days in 2016/17, equivalent to 10 members of staff. Volunteers have worked across a range of work areas including: Conservation; Walking route surveys; Beachwatch, Greeters; River Restoration; Footpath Work; Wardening; Rangering and as Work Placements. This is just the volunteers facilitated by the AONB team, it does not include huge numbers that volunteer for charities, community groups and those on corporate social responsibility work. The AONBs and associated Project Areas benefit hugely from this effort.

- 3. Snapshot..... of a Beachwatch event at Aldeburgh.....

Fifty eager Beavers, Cubs and Scouts, along with siblings and families, turned up in force on Saturday 8th July for the Suffolk Coast & Heaths AONB Beachwatch event organised especially for the Deben District Scouts. In total, they collected 10 Kgs of litter, a staggering 300 items along 200m of beach in Aldeburgh. This included 110 pieces of plastic and polystyrene, 60 pieces of cord, 14 shopping bags, 20 pieces of fishing net and fishing lines, 45 pieces of broken glass and bottles, 13 balloons. And a car filter!

  - The National Association for AONBs annual conference attracted over 100 representatives from the protected landscapes network. With a mixture of updates on the outstanding work being done, a briefing delivered by Simon Amstutz, AONB Manager on the concept of Natural Beauty, and other strategic presentations by HLF and the Defra minister responsible for AONBs, Lord Gardiner.

The annual Stour and Orwell Conference attracted 75 delegates and excellent media coverage. The conference included speakers from UK Power Networks on archaeology finds; Natural England on the England Coast Path; a new Recreational Avoidance & Mitigation Strategy in East Suffolk; and an update from the Marine Management Organisation. Delegates raised over £150 for Grenfell charities.
